Driven to change communities for the better, Fitzsimons dedicates sincere effort to serving the underserved—including expanding access to affordable banking and lending within neighboring Hispanic communities. The credit union counts the Juntos Avanzamos (Together We Advance) designation and Mountain West Credit Union Association's 2021 Credit Union of the Year Award among its accolades.

"Our members matter, no matter how much they have to deposit," Fryberger explains. "That starts with our structure, because we're not here to serve shareholders, and we don't treat members as a way to generate better profitability. They own the credit union."

Backed by a volunteer board of directors, the Fitzsimons team prioritizes making a difference over making a buck, bringing communities together through outreach efforts and events. Employees proudly support the Comitis Crisis Center, Downtown Aurora Visual Arts, and other local organizations.

"We're a community partner. We're passionate and compassionate, and we've stayed true to our purpose: being a trusted resource for communities while bringing more humility to banking," says Fryberger. "We've been proudly serving members since 1955 and can't wait to have you join us."



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
